Oldham library awarded top rating for sustainability

Oldham County's largest and newest library has received a top rating for its sustainability in building design, **construction** and operation, library director Susan Eubank said.

Eubank said the United States Green Building Council awarded a "gold" certification for the La Grange library's energy and environmental design.

She said it's the first certified public library in Kentucky with the rating.

The library opened in La Grange in 2009 and has earth-friendly traits that include a rainwater collection system, geothermal heating and cooling, and a charging station for electric vehicles.

It spans 30,000 square feet and replaced the 4,700-square-foot Duerson library on Ky. 146.
